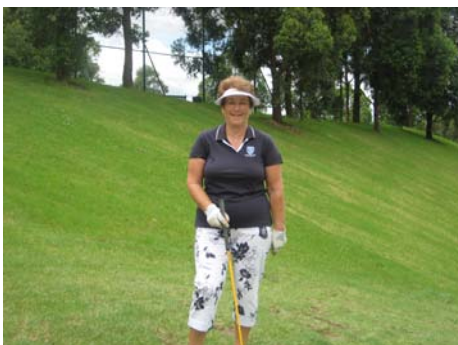

Golf Club Insurance - Members

Members are reminded that as part of their Asquith Golf Club Membership, their golf clubs are covered, Australia wide, from theft. Some Members clubs are worth quite a few thousand dollars, and it may be prudent to insure them through your own home and contents insurance, but for the general set of golf clubs, it is a good thing to remember.

The excess is \$550, which the Member will need to pay, then you have coverage up to \$3,500 worth of equipment. If you do have your clubs stolen, you will need to get a police report and fill in the appropriate forms, have them signed by the General Manager, and then the office will send them away for you.
